Alistair Brown covers the field from comic ditties, big ballads, songs of struggle (usually unsuccessful) against temptation, odes to conviviality & songs of unashamed sentimentality, to outrageously funny stories from a master of the art. Born in Scotland, he has been singing the old songs, and new songs written by people who like the old songs, since he was fifteen, and a regular at his local folk club.

After 30 years in Canada as a recording artist, radio broadcaster, columnist, festival director, dance teacher, university lecturer, and program director at folk music and dance camps, he now lives in Cornwall, where he calls dances and performs regularly in folk clubs, festivals, pub sessions and several ancient seasonal rituals that require the presence of accordions. 

Harlan Howard used to say that all you need for a great country song is three chords and the truth.

Maybe so, but when you take simple, southernstyle country, folk and blues music and put it in the hands of a killer guitarist, a whole world of people who never even knew they liked country, folk and blues music in the first place, start sitting up and paying attention.

After successfully making old sound new again with his last two efforts, Borrowed Horses and Cluck Old Hen, Fafard set out to reverse the tide and make the new sound old with his latest album, Fowl Mood. The songs were born in the woodshed next to Fafard's Studio.

The first melodic themes and bone structures came from chopping wood in the rain to heat the family home.

"It seems there is nothing harder than keeping a song simple. It's the reason the last two records were based on old classic southern tunes. I was studying how to get inside a simple song." muses Fafard. To get the right feel for Fowl Mood it had to be recorded live off the floor, which has become the standard recording practice for Fafard ever since he recorded the Juno-nominated record, ...and another thing... in 2006.

Such a humble recording practice can reap great benefits, but is not very common in the digital era of pitch perfect polish. Over half the tracks on Fowl Mood are first takes. "The vibe was good and we just kept moving onto the next song", recalls Fafard. "I was feeling free, the solos were improvised. It turned out pretty much the way I hoped it would."

Flora Knight & Sean Donald



Winners of the 2017 Gold Guitars 'Senior Overall Runner Up', 'Senior Traditional'.

Creatively titled 'Flora Knight and Sean Donald' are a duo who despite their disparate upbringings, coalesce to produce harmonious electricity. As the electrons collide, one can discern soft yet exciting songs and tunes, anything from the sad to the humorous.

Fiddle player and singer Flora Knight (The Eastern, The Lonesome Pine Specials) was raised in New Zealand, where singer and guitar picker Sean Donald (The All Day Breakfast Stringband, Pigeonhawk SB) was raised in Canada and now just a stones throw away from Knight, resides in Dunedin NZ.

The music that Sean and Flora play is reminiscent of a bygone era that resists the wear of time. Whether it's a rip roaring ragtime fiddle tune, a mournful country classic, or a sweet and silly waltz, they will have you on your toes both figuratively and literally. Their two voices blend beautifully to capture the tight country duet harmonies of the great turn of the century brother duets such as the Louvin Brothers and The Delmore Brothers. The fiddle tunes you will hear are largely steeped in the traditions of American folk music, and the silvery melodies will have you wish for reincarnation as Flora's fiddle itself.

Singer, song writer, acclaimed finger-style guitarist.

2016/17 was a 'gypsy year'. I wandered the globe while my home was being rebuilt after the 2011 Christchurch earthquakes. I did my ninth and tenth tours in Canada, playing festivals and concerts alongside some of Canada's top songwriters and musicians – The Stan Rogers Songwriters Festival in Canso, Nova Scotia; the Canterbury Folk Festival in Ingersoll, Ontario; the Island Folk Festival, Vancouver Island and The Salt Spring Island Music and Garlic Festival (yes, Garlic), were highlights. At home the Waiheke Island International Jazz Festival and the Queenstown Jazz Festival

were highlights. Now, back in Christchurch I will be more home based, with more recording on the menu. I have my studio set up again and I'm making progress with recording my original music and engineering for other artists. I'm keen to get a new CD out soon...

I'm really looking forward to playing for you.

An Evening with the Ferris Family & Friends

Coming from a musical background, Robin's mother – a wonderful pianist and father from County Antrim, Ireland a singer of mainly Irish songs, they performed in bands in Christchurch so it was little surprise that it would rub off on their youngest son, Robin. Having learnt guitar at age 10 he was fronting his first band – a trio called 'Kalaba' at age 15, performing at pubs, clubs and increasingly more at private gigs, Robin then led larger groups such as 'The Sage Dance Band' in the 70s and 80s and duos such as 'Y-Knot' and 'The Bollards', adding a seventeen year stint as a solo entertainer. Occasionally reforming bigger bands with fellow musicians since then, he at present works in the girl/guy band 'Something Else' and 'The Blarney Band' performing at gigs in Christchurch and throughout the South Island.

Jen Ferris joined with Robin to form 'Something Else' over a decade ago. Together they continue to develop and present a surprisingly versatile and quality mix of over 700 covers at weddings, birthdays, theme nights and other shows. Combining experience and two lead vocals, Martin guitar and light percussion they will entertain you with their stylish song selection and superb harmony arrangements.

As a third generation Ferris, Robin's son Ryan is a fully professional entertainer who has honed his craft, his voice and guitar playing in Europe, based in Berlin over the last 5 years during their summer. He has returned to

Christchurch to perform at often 2 or 3 gigs per week. He also writes, records and produces his own material and often pulls in fellow musicians to perform with him at gigs in Christchurch. Some of them, like him, are graduates from the Christchurch School of Music.

A variety of other muso friends have been invited to add their spice and sound to some of the numbers at this special Ferris Family Evening.

wherever he lands. He travels the state highways and byways of New Zealand, Australia, Europe and parts beyond, slinging songs and offering up low rent barroom philosophy with his band of misfits and chancers, The Eastern. He hopes for the best, prepares for the worst and believes in the poetry of Smokey Robinson and the Miracles and the fury of word on the page. He lives alone, cooks infrequently and is scared of flags that blow to the right.

He is happiest in front of a jukebox as the call for last drinks is given, because jukeboxes are harder to find, and the last drinks call means the lock in is ever closer. His songs have gathered a clutch of good reviews in NZ and overseas, he's been nominated for a couple of serious music awards (including the Apra Silver Scroll), Graham Reid from the NZ herald called him 'NZ's toughest minded songwriter' and Barry Saunders from The Warratahs simply described him as "The Truth".



Adam McGrath is a folk singer stationed With The Eastern and solo he has shared stages with and opened for Fleetwood Mac. Steve Earle, Old Crow Medicine Show, Jimmy Barnes and many more. But he takes the most pride in getting up and putting it down, in both small towns and big, choosing real gigs over showcases and the joy of shaking hands and sharing beers with the folks met along the way.

The Eastern are renowned for their ferocious roof raising live shows and have gathered a reputation for being the country's hardest working band plaving up to and beyond 200 shows a year, every year. Their latest album 'The Territory' was described as one of the best albums of 2014 from any band in any country by No Depression magazine.

Although such plaudits makes him blush behind his rapidly graving beard, McGrath is very thankful and hopes that in someway this might help him in continuing to pay his rent through his roundabout stories and admittedly pretty crappy guitar playing. A people's player, he works his ass off for any audience he finds himself in front of. Through, varns, ballads and barnstormers, he goes looking most nights of the year for that deep well of magic that threads through the humble folk song.

Described as "two parts Woody Guthrie, one part revival meeting and one part group hug" a McGrath show goes straight for the spirit level in all of us. Looking deep for the heart and hoping to reach the thinking part of the brain all the while strumming his three chords like his life depended on it. Which of course it does, as of course it should.


