Black board concerts ( Put your name on a blackboard and come up and perform a maximum of 2 songs)

Blind dates, (Put your name in the box, groups are randomly assigned and you have a day or so to work up a single song or musical performance with your group- always good fun, all are encouraged to take part)

Dress Circle concerts (same process as blackboard concerts)

Comedy Slot for poems or songs

Festival audiences tend to be supportive and attentive to other musicians and we have an excellent sound man who will help you sound your best.

A piece of festival etiquette is to keep spoken intros to performances short and be ready to take your place on the stage when your turn comes with instruments tuned etc.

There is a water fight, a tradition borrowed from the much loved Tui Festival. Whether you

consider yourself to be in your first childhood or your second, everybody loves a water fight on a

hot day, so anticipating that the young at heart will arm themselves with water weaponry and join in the battle between North and South of the mighty Waitaki river, especially since the weather promises to be very hot
